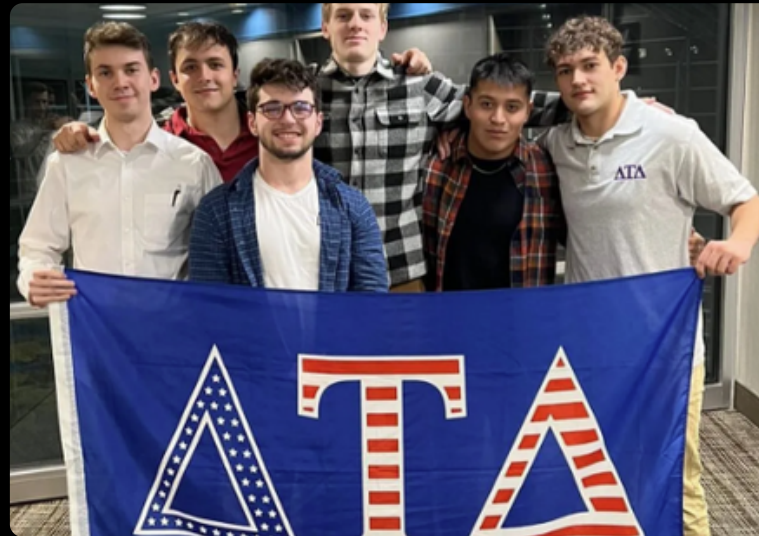

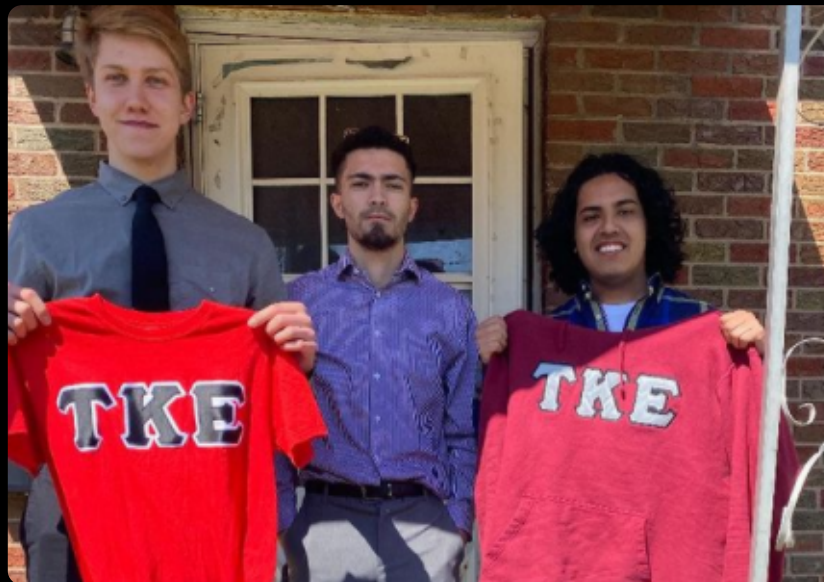

Alpha Phi Alpha™, the 1st intercollegiate Greek-letter fraternity established for African American Men, was founded on December 4, 1906™ at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York by 7 college men who recognized the need for a strong bond of brotherhood among African descendants in this country. The fraternity initially served as a study & support group for minority students who faced racial prejudice, both educationally & socially, at Cornell. The Jewel founders & early leaders of the fraternity succeeded in laying a firm foundation for Alpha Phi Alpha's principles of scholarship, fellowship, good character, & the uplifting of humanity.

While continuing to stress academic excellence among its members, Alpha also recognized the need to help correct the educational, economic, political, & social injustices faced by African Americans. Alpha Phi Alpha has long stood at the forefront of the African-American community's fight for civil rights through leaders such as W.E.B. DuBois, Adam Clayton Powell, Jr., Edward Brooke, Martin Luther King, Jr., Thurgood Marshall, and many others.

True to its form as the "first of firsts," Alpha Phi Alpha has been interracial since 1945. Since its founding on December 4, 1906™, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. has supplied voice and vision to the struggle of African Americans and people of color around the world.

A second chapter was established at the University of Illinois in 1912 and by 1921 there were chapters throughout the Midwest, the East, and one in the South.



Today the fraternity has over 700 undergraduate and alumni chapters in every state of the United States as well as chapters in the United Kingdom, Germany, South Korea, Japan, the Caribbean, and South Africa. The total membership of the fraternity exceeds 150,000.

Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. was founded at Howard University in Washington, D.C. on January 9, 1914, by three daring, young black students. The Founders wanted to organize a Greek letter fraternity that would truly exemplify the ideals of Brotherhood, Scholarship, and Service. They wanted their fraternity to exist as a part of an even greater brotherhood that would be devoted to the "inclusive we" rather than the "exclusive we".

From the beginning, the founders conceived Phi Beta Sigma as a mechanism to deliver services to the greater community. Rather than gaining skills to be utilized exclusively for themselves and their immediate families, the founders of Phi Beta Sigma held the deep conviction that they should return to their newly acquired skills to the community from which they had come. No longer a single entity, the fraternity has established the Phi Beta Sigma Educational Foundation, Inc. and the Phi Beta Sigma Federal Credit Union (to build financial equity within their target communities).

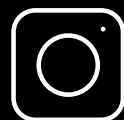
