WESTERN COMMITMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

Incoming freshmen with at least a 20 ACT and a 3.0/4.0 GPA are automatically awarded scholarship funds. Awards are renewable up to eight total semesters with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA, full-time enrollment and other renewable criteria met each semester. Deadline: May 15

TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS

New transfer students who finish any associate degree (including applied degrees) from an accredited institution and enroll full time at WIU will receive a one-time award.

FRESHMAN

The University primarily considers ACT/SAT scores and high school GPA in admissions decisions.
