Bus Safety and Accessibility Research Competitive Program (Opp. No. FTA-2025-003-TRI)

**CFDA No.:** 20.531

**Purpose:** To make existing and new buses safer for their operators and vulnerable road users, and safer and more accessible for their passengers.

**Eligibility:** Public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city, or township governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); small businesses; and for-profit organizations other than small businesses.

Funding: One award expected of \$10 million.

Farm to School Implementation Grant (Opp. No. USDA-FNS-F2S-2024-IMPL)

**CFDA No.:** 10.575

**Purpose:** To increase the availability of local foods in schools and connect students to the sources of their food through education, taste tests, school gardens, field trips, and local food sourcing for school meals. **Eligibility:** Native American tribal governments and organizations; nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); county, city, or township governments; and independent school districts.

Funding: \$5 million; awards between \$50,000 and

\$500,000.

**Purpose:** To provide Head Start and/or Early Head Start services to eligible children and families.

Eligibility: Public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, special district, city,

or township governments; public and

Native American housing authorities; federally recognized Native American tribal governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); small businesses; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; and independent school districts.

Justice for Families Program (Opp. No. O-OVW-2025-172266)

**CFDA No.:** 16.021

**Purpose:** To improve the response of the civil and criminal justice system to families with a history of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking, or in cases involving child sexual abuse.

Eligibility: State, county, special district, city, or township governments; federally recognized Native American tribal governments and organizations; and nonprofits with 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$14 million; awards between \$600,000

and \$700,000.
